

The evaluation of Question papers of F.Y.B.A. and F.Y.B.Com is done at college level adhering strictly to the rules and norms of the university

The faculty members take advantage of the Minor Research Project Schemes of UGC and BCUD Savitribai Phule Pune University. A conducive research culture has been developed by the research committee of the college.

As the college has limited financial resources, there are constraints to the development of the library building. However a section of land has been earmarked for development of a separate library building in near future. The college has sufficient computerization.
